.01 Purpose.

This directive establishes written policy and procedures governing public tours of Central Region Detention Facilities.

.02 Scope.

- A. This directive is applicable to the Central Region Detention Facilities excluding Chesapeake Detention Facility and Community Supervision:
 - (1) Baltimore Central Booking and Intake Center; and
 - (2) Baltimore City Detention Center.

.03 Policy.

- A. Touring by the public is permitted at the discretion of the Regional Executive Director and in coordination with the facility's Jail Administrator or designee.
- B. Tours are subject to change or cancellation due to current security conditions.

.04 Definitions.

There are no definitions needed for this directive.

.05 Responsibility.

Directive Number CRDET 195-0003

The Facility's Public Information Officer is responsible for coordinating the response to tour requests and shall:

- A. Forward requests for approval along with pertinent information to the facility's Jail Administrator and Chief of Security;
- B. On receipt of the facility's written response, provide a copy to the Regional Executive Director and request final approval for the tour;
- C. Communicate the final determination to the requestor, and when appropriate, relay necessary information regarding:
 - (1) Dress code;
 - (2) Contraband; and
 - (3) Other necessary information.
- D. In conjunction with security, develop a written itinerary appropriate for approved tours.
