Division of Correction Directive

.01 Purpose.

This directive establishes guidelines for developing, reviewing, modifying and communicating approved list of over-the-counter (OTC) medications.

.02 Scope.

This directive applies to all commissaries for Division of Correction facilities.

.03 Policy.

- A. All Division of Correction commissaries shall limit the sale of OTCs to items supported by the Office of Inmate Health Services.
- B. All Division of Correction inmates shall have consistent choices of OTCs regardless of the inmate's facility location.
- C. The Division of Correction and the Office of Inmate Health Services shall jointly review the list of approved OTCs yearly and make any appropriate changes.

.04 Definitions.

- A. In this directive, the following terms have the meanings indicated.
- B. Terms Defined.

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- (1) "Approved OTC" means over-the-counter medication approved for commissary operations.
- (2) "Commissary" means a service operation from which an inmate may purchase food, health items, and other sundry merchandise to enhance an inmate's health, welfare, and enjoyment.
- (3) "OIHS" means the Office of Inmate Health Services. This office is the medical authority for the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.
- (4) "OTC" means any over-the-counter medication sold without a prescription.

.05 Responsibility.

- A. The director, Office of Policy Development, Analysis and Management, with guidance and support from the OIHS is responsible for developing and maintaining an approved OTC list.
- B. <u>A commissary supervisor or designee is responsible</u> for using the approved OTC list to purchase OTC items for sale in commissary operations.
- C. A managing official, or designee is responsible for ensuring:
 - (1) OTCs available in commissary are on the approved OTC list; and
 - (2) Commissary receives a copy of the approved OTC list (Appendix 1).
- D. An officer is responsible for permitting an inmate to maintain OTCs not listed on Appendix 1 to this directive if an inmate purchased OTCs prior to implementing this directive.
