.01 Purpose.

- A. This directive establishes procedural guidelines for the handling, analysis, control and disposition of suspected controlled dangerous substances obtained in connection with a violation of law and/or institutional regulation.
- B. This directive establishes responsibility for the control and management of all suspected control dangerous substances obtained in connection with a violation of law and/or institutional regulation.

.02 Scope.

This directive applies to all facilities of the Division of Pretrial Detention and Services.

.03 Policy.

It is the policy of the Division that all CDS be handled in a manner which will properly preserve evidence for possible administrative proceedings and criminal prosecution.

.04 Definitions.

- A. In this directive, the following terms have the meanings indicated.
- B. Terms Defined.
 - (1) "Controlled Dangerous Substance" (CDS) means any substance as outlined in the Annotated Code of Maryland, Article 27, § 277.

.05 Responsibility.

A. Initial Discovery and Seizure

When suspected CDS is seized, the officer who personally seized the CDS shall be responsible to immediately:

- (1) Notify the supervisor; and
- (2) Request the assistance of the Contraband Control Officer, (CCO). If the CCO is not available, the officer shall, in the presence of the supervisor:
 - (a) In a clear plastic bag place:
 - (i) The suspected CDS;
 - (ii) A copy of the Matter of Record; and
 - (iii) A copy of a completed Maryland State Police Chain of Custody Form 67A
 - (b) Secure to the outside of the plastic bag:
 - (i) A copy of the Matter of Record; and
 - (ii) A copy of a completed Maryland State Police Chain of Custody Form 67A
 - (c) Place the bagged and documented suspected CDS in the designated vault;
 - (d) Record the deposit into the appropriate logbook;
 - (e) Notify the CCO of the seizure;
 - (f) In accordance with DPDS.020.003:
 - (i) Prepare a Serious Incident Report; and
 - (ii) Comply with all procedures related to the reporting of confiscation to the Facility Incident Report Manager (FIRM) as noted in the Correctional Indicators Data Reporting and Collection Manual.

B. Contraband Control Officer

The Contraband Control Officer shall be responsible for

(1) The processing of all suspected CDS in accordance with the Maryland State Police Operations Manual; and

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- (2) The development and annual review of standard operating procedures for the handling of suspected CDS, At a minimum, procedures shall address the following:
 - (a) Chain of custody;
 - (b) Evidence handling;
 - (c) Location and storage requirements;
 - (d) Laboratory analysis;
 - (e) Initiation of criminal charges, after positive testing, in accordance with current practices in effect between the Division and the Office of the State's Attorney;
 - (f) Manner of disposition; and
 - (g) Accountability measures to include audits, inventories and reports.
