.01 Purpose

This directive establishes procedures for the urinalysis testing of detainees in compliance with applicable standards and regulations.

.02 Scope.

The Division of Pretrial Detention and Services

.03 Policy.

The detainee population, especially those individuals who have access to the public, shall be routinely tested for illicit drug use.

.04 Definitions.

- A. In this directive, the following terms have the meanings indicated.
- B. Terms Defined.
 - (1) "Illicit drug" means the class of drugs which includes, but is not limited to, amphetamine, barbiturate, benzodiazepine, cannabis, cocaine, methadone, phencyclidine, opiates, phencyclidine or propoxyphene.

.05 Responsibility.

The warden shall be responsible to ensure that routine, uniform drug testing is conducted for detainee population. An institutional directive shall be issued/annually reviewed to address all applicable standards in the following areas;

- A. Selection of the testing sample to include:
 - (1) Random selection;

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- (2) Custodial status;
- (3) Program requirements;
- (4) Connection to the discovery of illicit drugs;
- (5) Behavior associated with intoxication or being under the influence;
- (6) Reliable tips; and
- (7) Other indicators appropriate for the institution/population.
- B. Sample testing size, appropriate for certain populations, (e.g. monthly testing of no less than ten percent (10%) of the committed population who have been assigned to building "X" for thirty (30) consecutive days or more. Special consideration shall be given to those residents having access to the public.
- C. Protocol for specimen collection and lab delivery to include:
 - (1) Chain-of-custody;
 - (2) Procedures for detainee refusal; and
 - (3) Timely delivery to the lab.
- D. Disciplinary action; and
- E. Documentation requirements.
