

- II. Applicable to: The Division of Pretrial Detention and Services
- III. Purpose: To establish policy and procedures to ensure the periodic medical evaluation of inmates after their initial intake.
- IV. Definitions: None
- V. Policy: It is the policy of the Division of Pretrial Detention and Services that inmates receive post-intake medical evaluations in compliance with established medical protocol.
- VI. Procedures
- A. Escapees
- The Security Chief shall promptly alert the Contractual Health Care Provider whenever an escaped inmate has been returned to the institution. Medical shall complete an evaluation on the inmate in accordance with the DCD# 130-100, Section 110.
- B. Routine Evaluations
1. Once each month, the DPDS Central Records Office shall provide a report of the following data to the Contractual Health Care Provider. (If modification to the selection criteria is required to retrieve advance identification of that inmate population, the Director of Central Records, or designee, is authorized to make appropriate changes.)
- a. Name, inmate # and housing location for each inmate in DPDS custody who is age 50, or greater, and has a commitment date between 330 and 365 days old; and

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- b. Name, inmate # and housing location for each inmate in DPDS custody who is under age 50 and has a commitment date more than 3 years and 11 months old.

2. The Contractual Health Care Provider shall:

- a. Pick up the report from the Office of Central Records after the 5th of the month;
- b. Perform the required examinations in compliance with DCD# 130-100 Sect 110 and DCD# 130-100 Sect. 112; and
- c. For those inmates initially identified by the DPDS Records Office, establish a tracking mechanism to ensure that annual and quadrennial examinations are completed for the duration of the inmates custody in DPDS.
