1	.03 A	A review of juvenile commitment folders for those admitted during the audit period indicates that all juveniles detained at DPDS were charged as adults.			
2	.03 B .05 A (1-2)	A review of:  -"physical body counts" or other detailed population reports for the audit period indicates separate and distinct housing areas are maintained for the adult and juvenile populations; and  - juvenile bed assignments indicates that when it was necessary to house a juvenile in special housing (e.g. protective custody) the juvenile remained separated from adults.			
3	.05 A (3)	A review of the DPDS Master Schedule and of program events (see A/W for Programs & Services) indicates that adults and juveniles are: - afforded comparable access to services and programs to the greatest degree possible and - remain separated to the greatest degree possible when in program and activity areas or common space.			
4	.05 (B) (1) (C) (1)	A review of: -Classification Instruments used for the audit period documents that appropriate juvenile housing was recommended for detainees under 18 years of age; and - Juvenile bed assignments for the audit period indicate that Traffic staff appropriately placed those detainees who were identified as juveniles.			
5	.05 (B) (2) (C) (2)	A review of: -base files indicates that juveniles are routinely monitored with regard to their 18 <sup>th</sup> birthday; and - bed assignments indicates that timely transfer to adult housing is made when a former juvenile reaches the age of 18 years.
