TITLE: Political Activity

I. REFERENCE: 5 USC Sec. 1501 - 1508

II. APPLICABLE TO: All Employees

III. PURPOSE: To provide guidance concerning political activity to

employees.

IV. PROCEDURE:

A. The Federal Law, with some exceptions, prohibits political activity on the part of State employees whose principal job is in connection with an activity which is financed in whole or in part by Federal loans or grants (Sections 1501 - 1508 of Title 5, USC).

(1) Employees may:

- (a) Register and vote.
- (b) Assist in voter registration drives.
- (c) Contribute to a political organization or attend a political fund raising function.
- (d) Wear or display political badges or stickers.
- (e) Attend political rallies and meetings.
- (f) Join a political club or party.
- (g) Sign nominating petitions.
- (h) Campaign for or against referendum questions, constitutional amendments, municipal ordinances, etc.
- (i) Engage in political activity if you are employed by an education research institution.

(2) Employees may not:

- (a) Campaign for partisan candidates or political parties.
- (b) Work to register voters of one party only.
- (c) Make campaign speeches or engage in other activity to elect a partisan candidate.
- (d) Be a candidate or work in a campaign of any candidate represents a national or State political party.

- (e) Collect contributions or sell tickets to political fund raising functions.
- (f) Distribute campaign material in a partisan election.
- (g) Organize or manage political rallies or meetings.
- (h) Hold office in a political club or party.
- (i) Circulate nominating petitions.
- (j) Campaign for or against a candidate or slate of candidates in a partisan election.
